We serve students who would not otherwise have access to a high-quality, college-prep education or professional work experiences.

A UNIQUE APPROACH TO MANAGING THE COSTS

Paid CWSP placements are critical to covering the school's educational costs and keeping family contributions low and affordable (capped at \$2,000 per year).
