Dear Friends of Cristo Rey New York High School:

When Javier came to Cristo Rey as a transfer sophomore, he was a reserved, quiet student who mostly kept to himself. Now as a senior, he looks back at his younger self and is proud of the progress he has made to become the more outgoing and well-rounded student he is today. He has pushed himself out of his comfort zone to make friends, join clubs, and ask teachers for extra help. In his words,

Graduate Support Program (GSP)

Our students continue to receive support to and through college. Before seniors graduate, they must complete the GSP's College 101 curriculum, where they learn the basics of being a successful college student. After graduation, our Director of GSP visits our alumni on their college campuses and reaches out to address any social, financial, academic, or emotional challenges they might have.

Mohamed Diallo Alumnus, Class of 2015

Mohamed Diallo, a self-described “troublemaker” in high school, never imagined he would be where he is today—a Boston College graduate currently pursuing a Master’s Degree in Educational Leadership and Policy at his alma mater. For Mohamed, his time at Cristo Rey was, in one word, transformational. “Cristo Rey and the people I met there saw a future for me that I never thought was possible,” he

says. Through the confidence he gained and the opportunities presented to him at CRNYHS, Mohamed’s future took on a different trajectory. Now, he is working to provide similar opportunities to others. With his degree, he hopes to “uplift others in spaces where there would otherwise be no representation...uplift the voice of the voiceless.”






STRONGER TOGETHER.


Central to Cristo Rey’s mission is the goal that our students will grow to become “professionals for others.” From the moment CRNYHS students step on campus, they are taught that there is power in working *with* and *for* others. They can achieve more together than they can alone, and they have the power to use their skills and talents for the betterment of the world around them.

In the wake of this past year’s racial justice movement, Cristo Rey students wanted to make their voices heard. They knew the best way to do that was to work together. Francisca Kwakye and Nashia Akuamoah-Boatema joined forces to found CRNYHS’ Black Student Union (BSU). The group’s goal would be to amplify student voices and “make sure our school promotes justice for all.” Starting the BSU required

help from the entire CRNYHS community. They worked with teachers on a club proposal, administrators to make it official, and classmates and peers to bring it to life. Joy Babalola, one of its first members, was thankful “to be supported by the whole CRNYHS community” because she knew that, collectively, they could better understand the issues and learn how to promote justice in our community.

Giving  to Each Other
Students and faculty hosted 100 hours of Campus Ministry Zoom room “hangouts” to sustain community bonds during this time of remote learning.

In 2020–2021, our students performed 2,200 hours of community service and helped give out 850 meals to those in need.

For CRNYHS alumna Emoni Anderson service is a way of life. As a licensed social worker serving as a mental health clinician in New York City, Emoni has taken Cristo Rey's mission to be a professional for others to heart. She says, "being an active participant in the CRNYHS community made a difference in how I think about

service and made me an agent of change for my community." During her time at Cristo Rey, she was inspired to dedicate her life to serving those in need in her own backyard. She discovered and developed her gifts, demonstrated her capacity to succeed, and chose a career teaching others how to do the same.

Joe McQuarrie views working at Cristo Rey as "an effective and powerful means of real social change." He believes that this change starts on the individual level —with each and every student that enters his classroom. Cristo Rey's cornerstone of *cura personalis* is the anchor of Joe's teaching method: "Kids simply learn better when they feel seen, heard, and valued, and our community is at its strongest

when everything stems from those care-based relationships." Kevin Hernandez has experienced the benefits of this first-hand. He appreciates that "Mr. McQuarrie always makes an effort to have conversations with students that go beyond school lessons to create a more comfortable environment and a deeper relationship. As a result of each new lesson and experience, I get closer to being the best person I can be."



WORKING TOWARDS A BRIGHTER FUTURE.

Cristo Rey students have their eyes on the prize of a brighter future for themselves, their families, and their communities. They work towards that goal everyday, whether that is in the classroom, during extracurricular activities, or at Corporate Work Study Program (CWSP) placements. By participating in CWSP, our students are developing professional skills and hands-on work experience to achieve that brighter future.

Alexandra Rivas-Smith Sadlier, SVP of Marketing Maday Sarmiento Class of 2022

Alexandra Rivas-Smith has been supervising Cristo Rey student workers at Sadlier since 2011. She decided to participate in CWSP because it “allows [her] to support, educate, and catapult diverse students to a better future, arming them with the confidence and courage to try new things.” One of those students is Maday Sarmiento, a Cristo Rey senior who has been working with Alex at Sadlier since

her sophomore year. Maday is grateful to call Alex not only her supervisor, but also a mentor. She describes Alex as someone who she “can always count on to be understanding, especially throughout the pandemic.” Through her work with Alex, Maday has learned professional skills that will set her apart and stay with her well into the future.

CRNYHS students typically earn 40% of the cost of their education through CWSP, giving themselves access to an invaluable college-prep education.

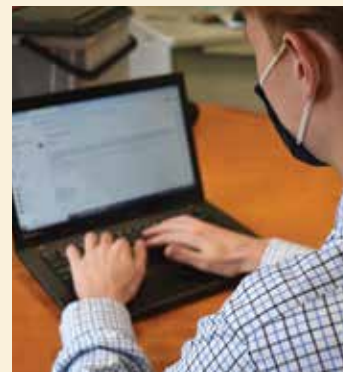
An Innovative and Effective Model

Our Corporate Work Study Program is an innovative educational and financial model that allows students to receive a private, college-preparatory education while gaining useful work experience. It began as a unique way to help fund our school. Seventeen years later, it has grown into a cornerstone of a Cristo Rey education.



Adapting to a Unique Set of Circumstances

Due to COVID-19, our Corporate Work Study Program model needed to adjust. With so many companies pivoting to remote work and dealing with their own setbacks, many of our student workers' jobs had to be put on pause. Fortunately, we have an amazing network of corporate partners that still wanted to find a way to support Cristo Rey. Thanks to their efforts and dedication, "Professionals for Others," or "P4O," was born. P4O is a new mentoring program where professionals from our various partner companies are paired with students to offer their unique perspectives into the corporate world. Students met remotely with their mentors throughout the year and worked with them to hone their professional skills so the students will not miss a beat when they return to in-person work.

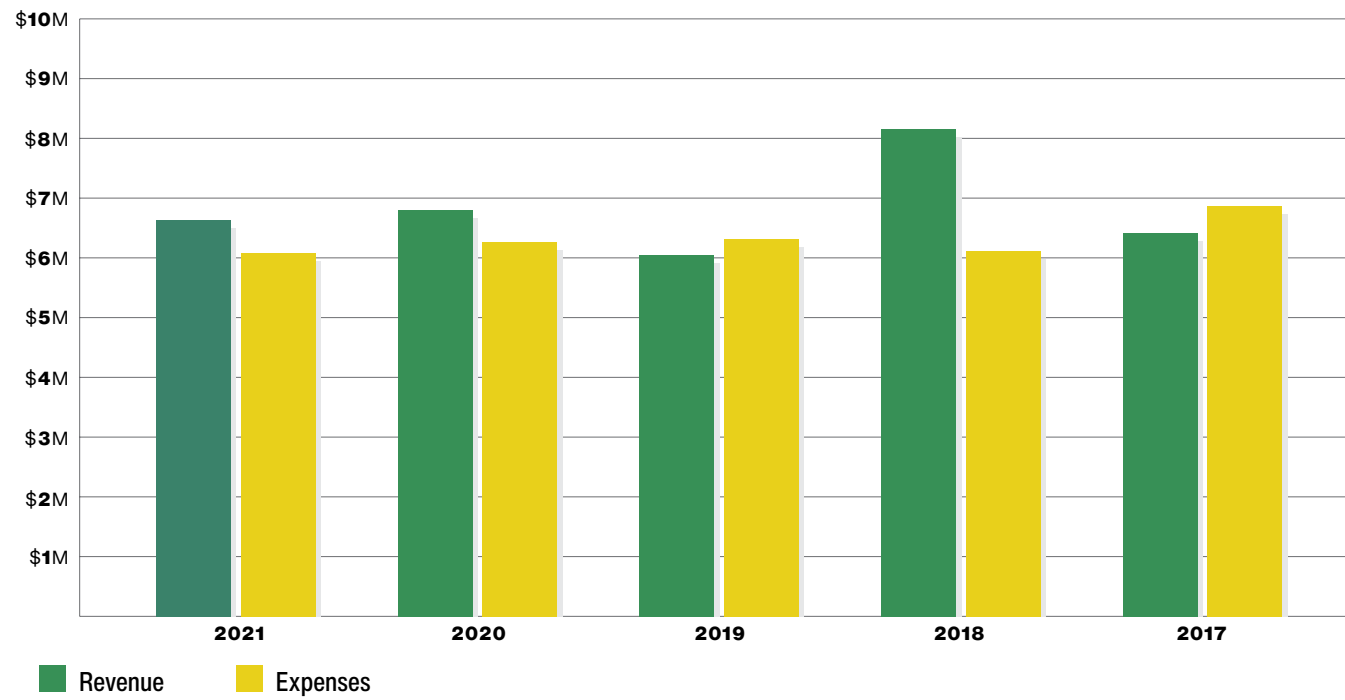

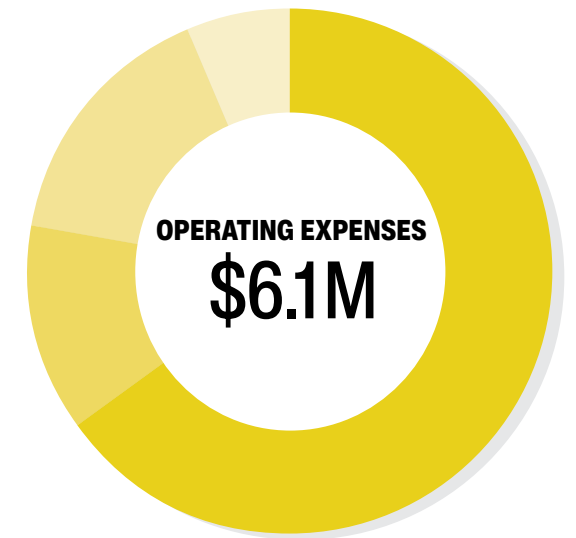
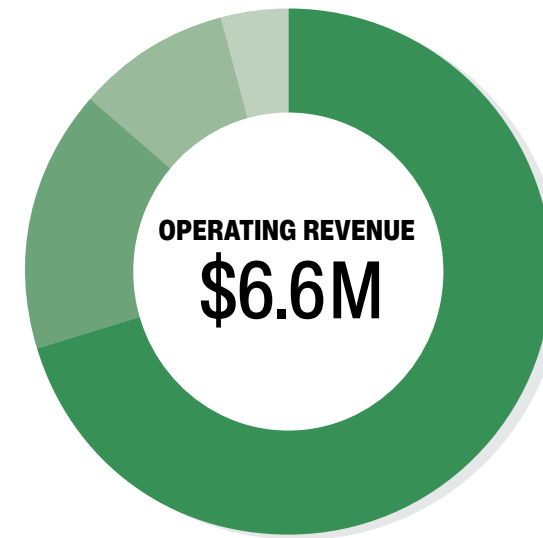
FIVE-YEAR FINANCIAL ANALYSIS
